FREE EARLY EDUCATION ENTITLEMENT

2 Year Olds

The Government has a scheme in place for 2 year old provision. This provides up to 15 hours free early years child education for families who are in receipt of certain benefits.

3-4 Year Olds

All 3/4 year olds from the term following their 3rd birthday are entitled to 15 hours of funded education per week (term time only) September 2017 the Government is introducing 30 hours per week of funded early years child education for 3 year olds. If you and your partner both work at least the equivalent of 16 hours per week at the national living wage - or national minimum wage for those aged under 25 - and earn less than £100,000 each, you may be eligible for 30 hours free childcare/nursery provision. In single parent households the same eligibility criteria applies to the lone parent. Parents/carers may choose to use this funding flexibly to best suit their needs although it may only be used across maximum of two sites.

LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE

The early year's curriculum is a stage of learning in itself, delivered in an age appropriate style. It is guided by the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum guidance from the DFE and is followed by all children from birth to five years old in the Pre-school, Nursery and Reception settings. The Early Years Curriculum covers seven areas which are aimed at igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning and to help build their capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive.

Communication and Language

Children develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves; and to speak and listen in a range of situations.

Physical Development

Children move confidently and imaginatively with increasing control and co-ordination and awareness of space and others. They are helped to understand the importance of physical activity and to make healthy choices about food.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children develop a positive sense about themselves and others; to form positive relationships and develop respect for others; develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings; to understand appropriate behaviour in groups and to have confidence in their own abilities,

Literacy

Encourage children to develop an interest in books and rhymes and early mark making and progressing to link sounds and letters and begin to read and write. Children's interest is enhanced through access to a wide range of reading and writing resources.
