Meet The Teacher Year 2 2019

The Year 2 teachers are Mr Waters and Mrs McLeod in Hazel Class and Mrs Hedley in Cherry Class. Our support staff are; Mrs Carter, Mrs McConnell and Mrs Humphreys.

Mrs Hinson and Mrs McConnell cover Year 2 when we are not teaching.

We encourage the children to do their best through:

House points

As you are aware, your child is in a "house." (Humford, Bolam, Plessey, Simonside, Kielder.)

They earn "house points" for their house for excellent work, effort, behaviour, manners etc. The house points are counted up each week and announced in assembly. The winning house each half term is awarded a house treat!

Golden Book

Each week we have a golden assembly on Friday morning. The teachers put the names of two children who have excelled in the golden book. They can stand up in assembly and receive a sticker and a small prize. Teachers keep a record of who has been in the book and all children will be entered during the year.

Traffic lights


We have a traffic light system in each classroom. The children's names are placed on the green light and we expect them to stay there. If a child behaves inappropriately, their name is moved to the amber light which is a warning. If inappropriate behaviour continues, the name will be moved to red and the child will miss some playtime. Children will start each new session of the day on green.


Golden Time

The children will earn golden time for good work/behaviour where they will be able to choose and play.

PHSEe lessons/ Circle time

We have planned Personal, Health, Social, emotional and Economic lessons each week where we give the children the opportunity to discuss their views, concerns, feelings and experiences openly.





PE: We have PE on Wednesdays and Fridays. Please ensure that your child has PE kit in school on these days: PE top, shorts, sandshoes. Please ensure that all PE kit is named! Please remove earrings on PE days or provide tape to cover them. Jewellery should not be worn in school.
