Wednesday 14th/ Thursday 15th December (both dates are in the morning) —Nativity (information to follow)


Quick reminders

- We have a school policy on no jewellery for health and safety reasons. If your child has recently had their ears pierced they may wear small studs for school with the exception of PE sessions. All other jewellery must not be worn.
