Our successful, happy and welcoming school has recently extended in age range to become a primary school with nursery provision. We are now able to offer an exciting and creative curriculum to children from the age of 3 to 11 years.

Our school is steeped in heritage, having been an established part of the local community since 1908, although it has grown significantly in size since then and now consists of four buildings on the original site. We have a new, modern building housing year 5 and 6 alongside a large hall, which is used for PE and lunch. The nursery is based in a purpose-built building, and works in partnership with West End Pre-School, who offer private provision for 2 year olds and Trinity Youth, who provide wrap around care for the school. This forms the innovative West Bedlington Early Years Partnership. Reception and Year 1 are based in the Early Years block, where there is a smaller hall, while Years 2, 3 and 4 are taught in the original building.

Our Ethos

At West End Primary School our staff have a shared vision. We believe in developing the 'whole' child. This is recognised by the parents "staff are concerned with not just the attainment of pupils, but with the overall character building of the young people in their care; they are encouraged to be confident, kind and polite children" (Parent).

We aim to develop well-rounded, confident, enterprising, hardworking and caring citizens of the future, who embrace and respect the diversity of the local, national and international community. It is important to us that our children understand their place in our local community; as such the children regularly represent the school at events within the local community. Our community links are recognised as one of our strengths. It is important to us that children understand their place in the national and international community and develop caring, respectful and compassionate views, which will help them to navigate the complex world we live in and make a difference for the better.

Teaching and Learning

At West End Primary School you'll find the staff and children are fun and full of life. We believe that happy children learn so, as a team, we have designed a rich, creative and progressive curriculum, which engages and stimulates the children's interest. Staff know how children learn best, planning and implementing engaging and exciting lessons which are closely matched to the children's age and stage of development.

We know that children learn best when they are taught through a contextualised curriculum, with real and meaningful experiences at the heart of all learning. Regular themed writing weeks provide inspiration for writing and throughout each year the children

Our wider curriculum supports and challenges children to be the best they can be in every area and we are proud to have achieved a Gold Sports Award for three years running – quite an achievement for a school with no field!

The staff's collegiate approach to creating the best provision for the children is a further strength of the school. "Teamwork and collegiality are the hallmarks of the adults in the school. There is a sense of agitation and restlessness to challenge and question each other continually" (OFSTED 2019) This is possible as the staff experience a great sense of trust in the leadership team and each other.

Our school has strong links with our partnership schools in the community. This is used to good effect to support curriculum development. Practical arrangements include leasing St. Bede's RC Primary's field for PE.

Our Aims

We were last inspected in February 2019 and were once again rated good. The report can be viewed on our school website.

We look forward to welcoming a new Headteacher in September who will work with us on the next steps from this report and also our current School Development Plans, which focus on:

- Our on-going Covid 19 recovery planning.
- Using the 'Whole Education' SEND programme to improve provision for our children with SEND.
- Creating an ethos of support and nurture to promote good mental health and well-being for pupils and staff.
- Our work with the Education Endowment Foundation with an aim to making a difference for disadvantaged pupils.
