Homework Organisation Key Stage One

We have used a flexible homework system in Key Stage One for a number of years and this has always worked very well. We realise that families have very busy lives and we hope that our system will allow you to get involved in your child's education without it becoming a burden. Of course, playing board games, reading stories and going on nature walks are all good ways to interact with your child too.

- *Your child will be given a sheet each half term with 10 homework challenges on it from across the curriculum. We would like you to choose <u>at least 2</u> in the half term but feel free to do as many as you want.
- *Last year we trialled whether our families preferred to work in a book or on class dojo and we found that class dojo was much more popular and also saved on paper. The choices sheet will be sent home for you to read and then posted as an activity on class dojo.
- *If you have a busy weekend, do not feel that you need to squeeze homework into it!
- *When you have a less busy week, choose one of the homework challenges to complete and submit it on class dojo.
- *Each activity has been posted separately on class dojo and we have chosen the most obvious way to record it whether that is by text, photo or video. However, feel free to present it however you would like to. If you want to send a hard copy in to show us that is fine too. The children often like to bring in their artwork or models.
- *Homework maybe submitted whenever it is completed.

There is no set day to hand it in.

Teachers will log into class dojo once or twice a week to approve homework so it may not be marked the same day that it is submitted. Homework will be awarded a house point and 5 class dojo points.
