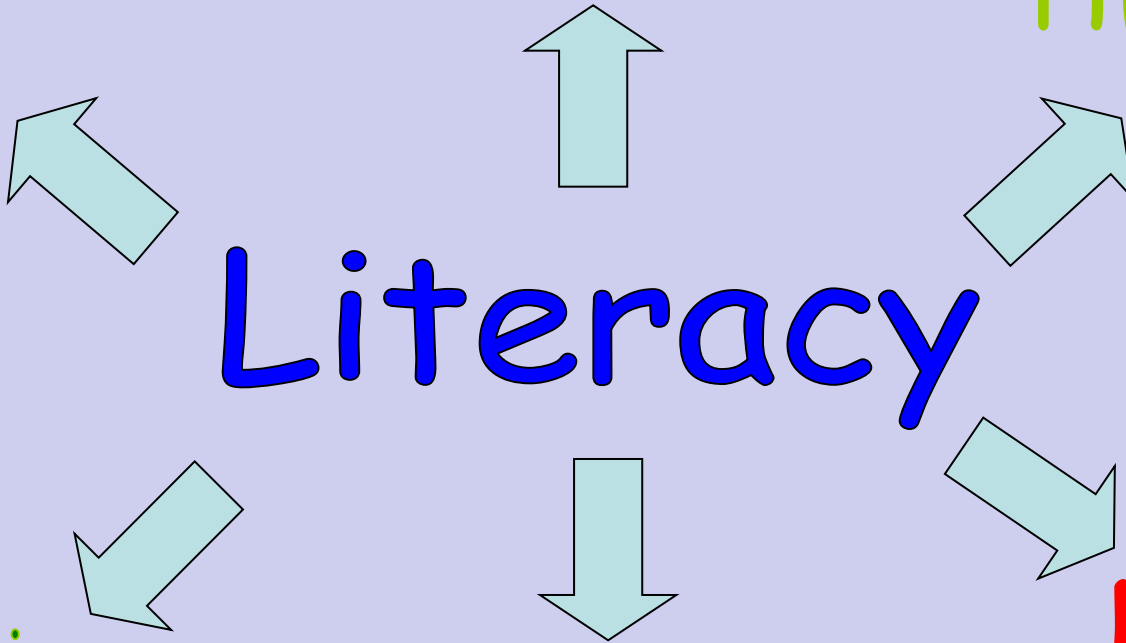

## What Are We Looking For in Children's Writing?

Capital letters and full stops used accurately and consistently.

A wider range of punctuation including ? ! and ""

Descriptive words and phrases chosen for effect.

Different sentence openers including adverbs and connectives to create more complex sentences.

Writing at length (About 200 words) with increasing independence.





# Spelling

In Year 3, we will have a dedicated spelling lesson each week where the children are grouped, according to their spelling targets. This is in order to help the children make progress at their own level.

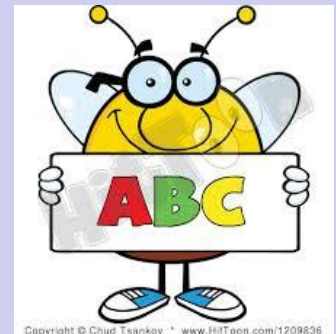
They will also practise spellings in school during the week, although they will not be formally tested each week.
