School Dinners





If Your Child has to Isolate

We have been very fortunate so far that we have only needed to close one bubble due to a positive Covid case. The children affected were all asked to isolate for 14 days to prevent the spread of the virus. We know this can be very inconvenient but it is essential to keep the spread of the virus under control. Unfortunately we have been made aware that a small number of children who should have been isolating at home have been out and about attending sports clubs and going shopping with their parents.

It is essential that your child isolates properly if their bubble is closed, even if they are not symptomatic themselves. We know that children can have the virus without showing any symptoms, so if your child is out in the community when they should be isolating they could be spreading the virus to your family, friends and acquaintances and the general public, which could have a devastating impact for someone. Please consider everyone else if your child is asked to isolate.




Homework via Class Dojo


